BACKGROUND

The Township conducted its annual budget survey to gather community feedback for consideration in the development of the 2026 municipal budget. As part of the Township's public engagement efforts, the survey was hosted online and promoted through the Township website, social media channels, and the final tax billing newsletter. The survey was open from August 8 to September 14, providing residents with an opportunity to share their perspectives on municipal services, priorities, and spending.

ANALYSIS

Budget Survey Highlights:

- The Township received 41 responses (46 in 2025, 25 in 2024, 33 in 2023, 104 in 2022).
- 51% of respondents selected the tax bill newsletters as their preferred type of communication, with digital methods at 44%.
- 44% of respondents indicated that satisfaction with municipal services has improved over the
 past year (up slightly from 42% in 2025). Another 44% rated their satisfaction as neutral,
 consistent with last year's results.
- 63% of respondents indicated they would not support a green bin (organics) program if offered in the future, suggesting limited community interest at this time.
- 80% of respondents indicated that the Township is maintaining its infrastructure to an acceptable standard, including 56% who agreed and 24% who felt this was the case most of the time, demonstrating overall satisfaction with infrastructure maintenance and renewal.
- 44% of respondents supported increasing property taxes to fund infrastructure renewal, including 17% who felt it should be a top priority and 27% who supported modest increases of up to 2%. Meanwhile, 51% indicated they are supportive of renewal efforts but do not support further tax increases beyond current levels.

- 44% of respondents supported reasonable tax increases to maintain existing service levels (i.e., inflationary adjustments), while 32% preferred to cut services to maintain current tax levels.
 Meanwhile, 20% favoured increasing taxes to enhance or expand municipal services, and only 5% supported cutting services to reduce taxes
- The majority of respondents (75% on average) supported maintaining current service levels, while 22% preferred to see enhancements in select areas such as by-law enforcement, building services, and communications. Only 3% of respondents suggested any service reductions.

A full breakdown of the survey results and a copy of the online survey are included in the attachment.

Survey results have been distributed to Managers for consideration in building their respective departments' 2026 budget and will be made available to the public on the Township's website.








1. Which of the following statements describes your connection to the Township?






2. How long have you resided in Adelaide Metcalfe?







3. Where do you live (or own property) in Adelaide Metcalfe?






4. What is your age bracket?








6. Current Communication Methods








- Why do we need so much equipment when we hire contractors to do road construction and other projects

- Keep up the good work


